Natural Attributes of God—Part 1

(Omniscience, Omnipresence and Omnipotence)



LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- To teach that the Omniscient God knows all our needs
- To show that the Omnipresent God is able to give us His total attention and care
- To teach that nothing is impossible for our Omnipotent God



SCRIPTURE PORTION

Ps. 139 (Omniscient/Omnipresent/Omnipotent God)



MEMORY VERSE

Eph.3:20: Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us.



BIBLE PASSAGE

Psalm 139:1-18

You have looked deep into my heart, Lord, and You know all about me. You know when I am resting or when I am working, and from heaven You discover my thoughts. You notice everything I do and everywhere I go.

Before I even speak a word, You know what I will say, and with your powerful arm you protect me from every side. I can't understand all of this! Such wonderful knowledge is far above me.

Where could I go to escape from Your Spirit or from Your sight? If I were to climb up to the highest heavens, You would be there. If I were to dig down to the world of the dead You would also be there. Suppose I had wings like the dawning day and flew across the ocean.

Even then Your powerful arm would guide and protect me. Or suppose I said, "I'll hide in the dark until night comes to cover me over." But You see in the dark because daylight and dark are all the same to you.

You are the one who put me together inside my mother's body, and I praise you because of the wonderful way You created me. Everything You do is marvelous! Of this I have no doubt. Nothing about me is hidden from You! I was secretly woven together deep in the earth below, but with Your own eyes You saw my body being formed. Even before I was born, You had written in your book everything I would do.

Your thoughts are far beyond my understanding, much more than I could ever imagine. I try to count Your thoughts, but they outnumber the grains of sand on the beach. And when I awake, I will find You nearby.

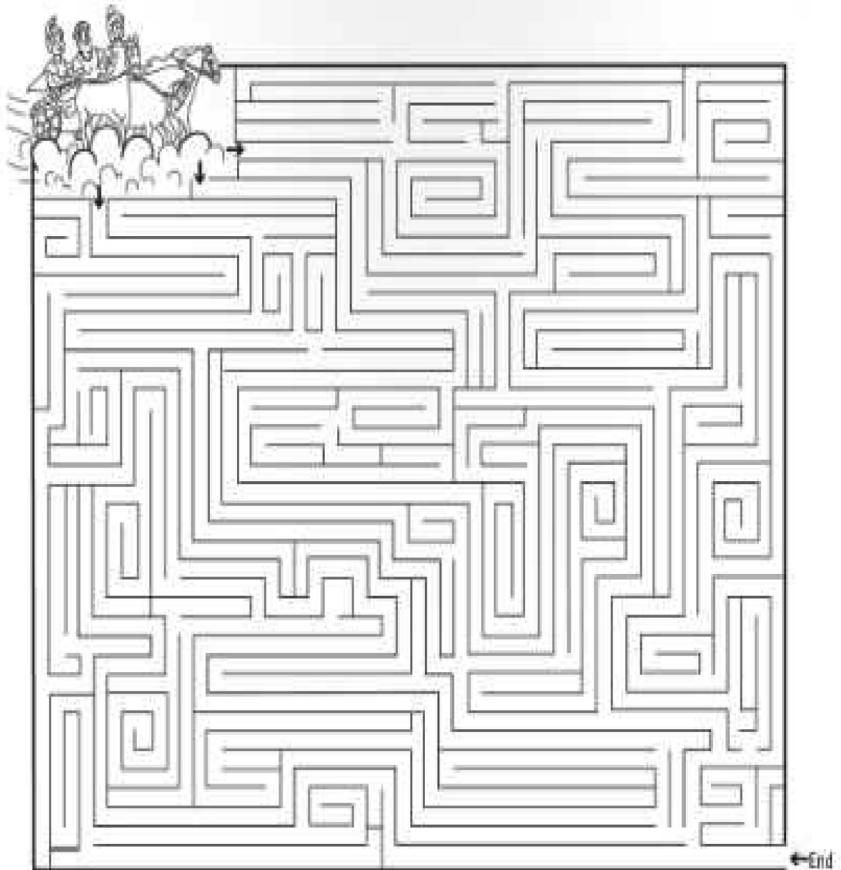

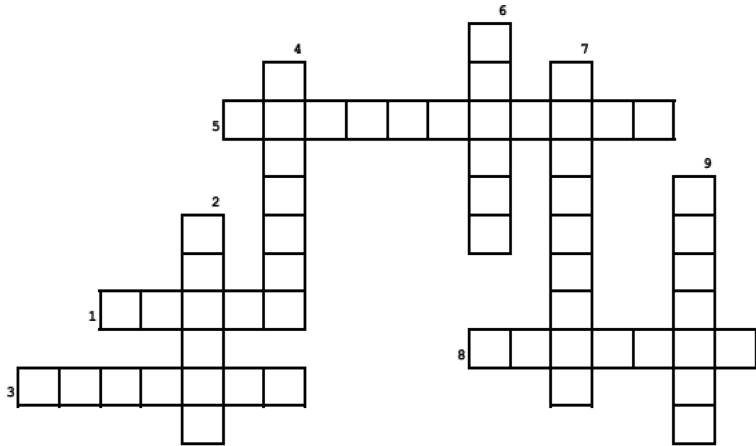

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- To show the amazing Justice of God which made Him punish Himself - instead of us
- To teach that God will not force us to stay within His Perfect love if we choose not to



SCRIPTURE PORTION

Heb.12:5-13 (God Disciplines out of Love)

Rom.6:23; Mt.7:21-23 (God Punishes because He is Just)

BIBLE PASSAGE:

Heb.12:5-13:

"... the Scriptures say to God's children, "When the Lord punishes you, don't make light of it, and when He corrects you, don't be discouraged. The Lord corrects the people he loves and disciplines those he calls his own."

Be patient when you are being corrected! This is how God treats His children. Don't all parents correct their children? God corrects all of His children, and if He doesn't correct you, then you don't really belong to Him. Our earthly fathers correct us, and we still respect them. Isn't it even better to be given true life by letting our spiritual Father correct us?

Our human fathers correct us for a short time, and they do it as they think best. But God corrects us for our own good, because He wants us to be holy, as He is. It is never fun to be corrected. In fact, at the time it is always painful. But if we learn to obey by being corrected, we will do right and live at peace.

Now stand up straight! Stop your knees from shaking and walk a straight path. Then lame people will be healed, instead of getting worse.

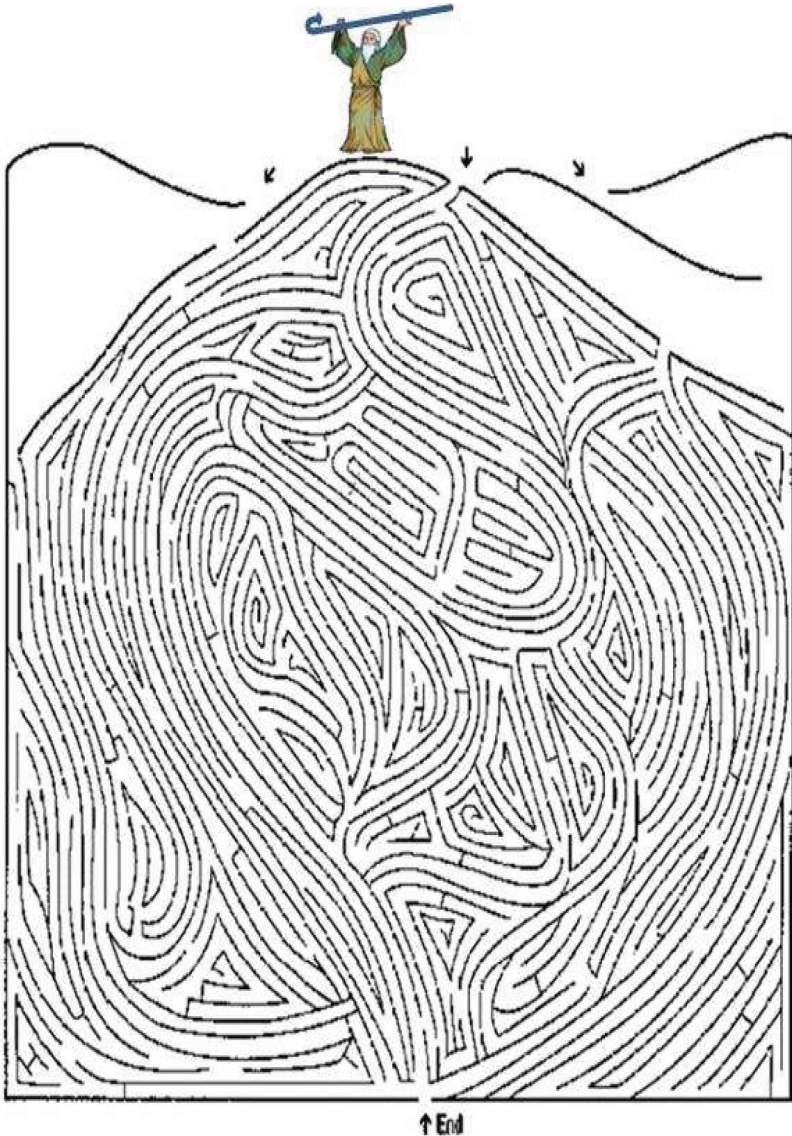

- To teach the importance of following God's directions in receiving our healing

**BIBLE PASSAGE****Luke.5:17-26:**

One day as Jesus was teaching, Pharisees and religion teachers were sitting around. They had come from nearly every village in Galilee and Judea, even as far away as Jerusalem, to be there. The healing power of God was on Him.

Some men arrived carrying a paraplegic on a stretcher. They were looking for a way to get into the house and set him before Jesus. When they couldn't find a way in because of the crowd, they went up on the roof, removed some tiles, and let him down in the middle of everyone, right in front of Jesus. Impressed by their bold belief, he said, "Friend, I forgive your sins."

That set the religion scholars and Pharisees buzzing. "Who does He think He is? That's blasphemous talk! God and only God can forgive sins."

Jesus knew exactly what they were thinking and said, "Why all this gossipy whispering? Which is simpler: to say 'I forgive your sins,' or to say 'Get up and start walking'? Well, just so it's clear that I'm the Son of Man and authorized to do either, or both..." He now spoke directly to the paraplegic: "Get up. Take your bedroll and go home." Without a moment's hesitation, he did it—got up, took his blanket, and left for home, giving glory to God all the way. The people rubbed their eyes, incredulous—and then also gave glory to God. Awestruck, they said, "We've never seen anything like that!"

Discuss:

Luke starts off the Story of the Paralytic with the words, “...the power of the Lord was with Jesus to heal the sick” (Lk.5:17). Why does Luke specifically mention these words? Isn’t it general knowledge that Jesus possesses the power to heal?

BIBLE PASSAGE

Isa.53:3-12:

He was hated and rejected; His life was filled with sorrow and terrible suffering. No one wanted to look at Him. We despised Him and said, "He is a nobody!" He suffered and endured great pain for us, but we thought His suffering was punishment from God. **He was wounded and crushed because of our sins; by taking our punishment, He made us completely well.**

All of us were like sheep that had wandered off. **We had each gone our own way, but the Lord gave Him the punishment we deserved.** He was painfully abused, but he did not complain. He was silent like a lamb being led to the butcher, as quiet as a sheep having its wool cut off. He was condemned to death without a fair trial. Who could have imagined what would happen to Him? His life was taken away because of the sinful things my people had done.

He wasn't dishonest or violent, but He was buried in a tomb of cruel and rich people. ¹⁰**The Lord decided His servant would suffer as a sacrifice to take away the sin and guilt of others.** Now the servant will live to see His own descendants. He did everything the Lord had planned. By suffering, the servant will learn the true meaning of obeying the Lord. Although

He is innocent, He will take the punishment for the sins of others, so that many of them will no longer be guilty. The Lord will reward Him with honor and power for sacrificing his life. Others thought He was a sinner, but He suffered for our sins and asked God to forgive us.

2 Cor.5:21 too says, “Christ never sinned! But God treated Him as a sinner, so that Christ could make us acceptable to God.”

These verses establish Three Basic Facts:

- **Our sinfulness attracted Two Results:**
 - entry of sickness and disease into the world leading to decay and death. (Adam and Eve began to experience diseases like cough, fever, and weakness of old age).
 - eternal punishment in hell after death
- But Jesus **took our sinfulness** upon himself. When He did this, **two things happened:**
 - He **took the Punishment for our sins** – which we should have actually got. As a result, we don’t have to bear the punishment of hell anymore.
 - He **took the Consequences for our sins** – which we should have actually got (including sickness and disease). As a result, we don’t have to bear the suffering from sickness anymore.
- Jesus didn’t stay dead. He **defeated sickness and death** and came back to life. If we choose to live ‘in’ and ‘through’ Jesus, we too can defeat sickness and death.

Based on what we have learnt, what would be your reaction if you prayed for healing for an entire month and nothing happens? Would you conclude that God doesn't want to heal you?

If it's true that God wants to heal even incurable diseases, what should I do? What if I pray for two months, and still nothing happens? Should I give up?

When it comes to healing, why is it so important to hear from God clearly?

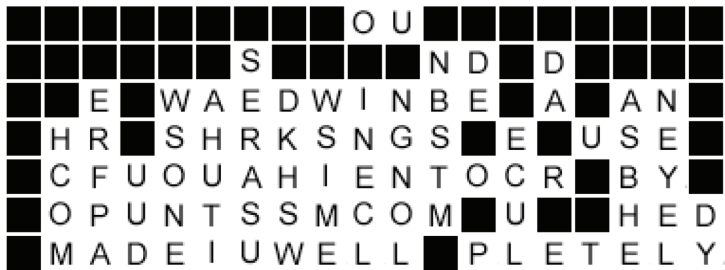
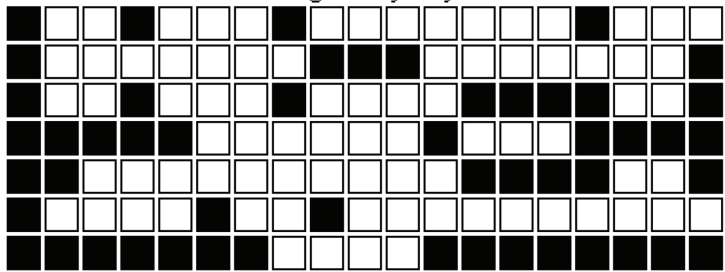
