

Develop A Positive Self-Image – Repaint Your Portrait Sunday November 17, 2024

Self-image refers to the mental picture or perception a person has of themselves.

Self-esteem is the emotional evaluation of one's self-worth, essentially how much a person likes and values themselves based on their self-image.

Self-image is how you see yourself, while self-esteem is how you feel about yourself.

A positive self-image is developed over time through consistent positive and healthy practices.

Negative experiences can impact self-image, but it is possible to overcome these.

WHY IS A POSITIVE SELF-IMAGE IMPORTANT?

A positive self-image is important because it directly impacts how you feel about yourself, influences your interactions with others, your ability to pursue and achieve goals, and overall mental and emotional well-being. A positive self-image affects your confidence, resilience, how you build relationships and how you face life's challenges.

A BIBLICAL APPROACH TO DEVELOPING A POSITIVE SELF-IMAGE AND BUILDING YOUR SELF-ESTEEM

#1, BE ESTABLISHED IN YOUR IDENTITY IN CHRIST

Repaint your portrait based on your identity in Christ.

The Word of God is our spiritual mirror.

James 1:22-25

22 But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.

23 For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror;

24 for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was.

25 But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does.



In Christ we have become a new creation. We have a new identity in Christ. We need to look at ourselves in the "mirror of God's Word" and see who we are in Christ.

2 Corinthians 5:17

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

#2, CONSTANTLY ACKNOWLEDGE YOUR IDENTITY IN CHRIST

Agree with God and say what God says about who you are in Christ.

Proverbs 4:20-21a

20 My son, give attention to my words; Incline your ear to my sayings. 21 Do not let them depart from your eyes;...

How do you view your giants?

We know the story of Joshua and Caleb and the other 10 spies. All of them had God's promise. Yet 10 of them saw themselves as grasshoppers before the giants. Joshua and Caleb saw the giants as bread that could be easily consumed.

#3, FOCUS ON YOUR COMPLETENESS THAT COMES FROM CHRIST

Recognize God's empowering through your life in Christ.

1 Corinthians 1:30

But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God—and righteousness and sanctification and redemption—

All that is in Jesus has been made available to us through our life in Christ.

Colossians 2:9-10 9 For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; 10 and you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power.

We are complete in Him. Our shortcomings, our weaknesses are overcome by His fullness.

Slide: Picture of David facing Goliath

Like David we can face our 'Goliaths', out of our completeness in Jesus.

Whenever you feel insufficient, declare that your sufficiency comes from Jesus (2 Corinthians 3:5).

Whenever you feel incapable, declare you can do all things through Christ who strengthens you (Philippians 4:13).

#4, COUNTER AND DISCARD NEGATIVE THOUGHTS

Consciously counter and discard negative thoughts by declaring who you are in Christ.

2 Corinthians 10:4-5

#5, FELLOWSHIP WITH LIKE-MINDED BELIEVERS

Spend time with believers who know their identity in Christ and who can uplift and encourage you.

Philemon 1:6

that the sharing of your faith may become effective by the <mark>acknowledgment of every</mark> good thing which is in you in Christ Jesus.

2 Corinthians 5:16-17

16 Therefore, from now on, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we have known Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know Him thus no longer. 17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

Paul is teaching us that we relate to other believers not "according to the flesh", but rather according to who we are in Christ, and we acknowledge the good things that are in each other in Christ. This is how the sharing (fellowship) of our faith will be effective.

Develop A Positive Self-Image – Repaint Your Portrait Sunday November 17, 2024

The is a simple guide for use in Life Group discussions. Our objective is to focus on the application of the Sunday sermon - how each one is becoming a doer of the Word and building their life on God's Holy Word. The Life Group meeting would normally last for 1.5 to 2 hours. Each Life Group would have up to 12-15 people.

Preparation

Life Group Leader: To prepare for the Life Group meeting, you can listen to the Sermon or review the Sunday Sermon notes. Please do not make your life group read through the complete sermon notes during the life group. All you need to do is have individuals read the Scriptures listed below and then open for a time of discussion, sharing and learning using the questions given below. All these are available in the "All Peoples Church Bangalore" mobile App or online at our sermons page. Pray for the Life Group meeting and invite the work and ministry of the Holy Spirit.

Welcome

The Life Group meeting may commence with a time of prayer, worship, and a fun activity.

LISTEN to God's Word

Read the following Scripture references: 2 Corinthians 5:17; 1 Corinthians 1:30; Colossians 2:9-10

INVESTIGATE God's Word Together

Life Group is a discussion-based, participatory meeting with everyone given the opportunity to share their learning. Please discuss a few of these together, giving time for people to share their insights. We encourage each one individually to make notes of their personal learning during the Group discussion.

#1, Why is a positive self-image important? How does our self-image and self-esteem affect our daily life?



#2, Describe your portrait of who you are in Christ. Use the "Identity" section in the Toolkit menu in the APC Church App.

#3, Discuss what it means to be complete in Him according to Colossians 2:9-10. How do we live this out when we feel insufficient or incapable in real life situations?

Each one can take a few (3 minutes max) to share one or two key insights and how they see themselves applying it to their specific life situations. Encourage each one to participate and share.

FELLOWSHIP by sharing your life and spiritual journey

Each one takes a few (3 minutes max) to share anything from their walk with God, something God has been teaching them, a testimony of answered prayer or a specific challenge that they would like prayer for. Encourage each one to participate and share.

ENCOURAGE each other by praying and ministering to one another

Get into small groups of two or three and take turns to thank God and pray for each other in the light of what was learnt today. Listen to the Holy Spirit. Expect the gifts of the Holy Spirit to flow, bringing healing, releasing miracles, prophecy, etc.

Regroup and pray together for:

1, families to be protected and strengthened

2, a mighty outpouring of God's Holy Spirit on us as a church and through us to bless many others in our city and nation. Nothing but a mighty work of God's Spirit can change our city and nation.

3, for the BUILD TO IMPACT project - for all details to go well as we plan and build our Bible college and church facilities to serve the Lord and people.

SERMON OUTLINE

In this sermon we discuss a Biblical approach to developing a positive self-image and building our self-esteem. Self-image is how you see yourself, while self-esteem is how you feel about yourself. A positive self-image is important because it directly impacts how you feel about yourself, influences your interactions with others, your ability to pursue and achieve goals, and overall mental and emotional well-being. A positive self-image affects your confidence, resilience, how you build relationships and how you face life's challenges. (1) Be established in your identity in Christ. Repaint your portrait based on your identity in Christ. The Word of God is our spiritual mirror. (2) Constantly acknowledge your identity in Christ. Agree with God and say what God says about who you are in Christ. (3) Focus on your completeness that comes from Christ. Recognize God's empowering through your life in Christ. All that is in Jesus has been made available to us through our life in Christ. (4) Counter and discard negative thoughts. Consciously counter and discard negative thoughts by declaring who you are in Christ. (5) Fellowship with like-minded believers. Spend time with believers who know their identity in Christ and who can uplift and encourage you.
