



God's Provision for Healing – Divine Healing (Part-2)
Sunday November 09, 2025 – Sermon Outline

We learn from Scripture that God has made full and complete provision for the healing of our bodies and minds through the Cross of Jesus Christ. We learn about our redemption blessings, the authority given to us to administer healing, and faith that makes God's provision accessible and available to all.

THE CROSS

We know without question that healing has been provided in the atonement.

Isaiah 53:4-5

4 Surely He has borne our griefs (*sickness*) And carried our sorrows (*pains*); Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted.

5 But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace (*wholeness*) was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed.

Matthew 8:16-17

16 When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick,

17 that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: "HE HIMSELF TOOK OUR INFIRMITIES AND BORE OUR SICKNESSES."

1 Peter 2:24

who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes you were healed.

Healing is a completed work – “were healed”. See yourself healed according to God’s Word.

REDEMPTION

Healing and wholeness are redemption blessings.

Job had a revelation of what the blessings of “the ransom” would include.

Job 33:21-25



21 His flesh wastes away from sight, And his bones stick out which once were not seen.

22 Yes, his soul draws near the Pit, And his life to the executioners.

23 "If there is a messenger for him, A mediator, one among a thousand, To show man His uprightness,

24 Then He is gracious to him, and says, 'Deliver him from going down to the Pit; I have found a ransom';

25 His flesh shall be young like a child's, He shall return to the days of his youth.

He speaks of healing to the body. Body that was dying being restored in health, strength and energy.

In the Old Testament, the “curses of the Law”, the curses for disobedience as listed in Deuteronomy 28:15 onwards. These include all kinds of sickness of body and mind. Here is a small section:

Deuteronomy 28:58-61

58 "If you do not carefully observe all the words of this law that are written in this book, that you may fear this glorious and awesome name, THE LORD YOUR GOD,

59 then the LORD will bring upon you and your descendants extraordinary plagues—great and prolonged plagues—and serious and prolonged sicknesses.

60 Moreover He will bring back on you all the diseases of Egypt, of which you were afraid, and they shall cling to you.

61 Also every sickness and every plague, which is not written in this Book of the Law, will the LORD bring upon you until you are destroyed.

Sickness and disease of body and mind were listed under the curse, not under the blessing.

The New Testament announces clearly that we are redeemed from the curse of the Law – the Law itself, and the accompanying curses for failure to keep the Law.

Jesus became a curse for us so that He could redeem us from the curse. This is not talking about the written Law, but the curses of disobedience to the written Law. He became cursed with the curses of disobedience, as though He was the disobedient one.

Galatians 3:13-14

13 Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, "CURSED IS EVERYONE WHO HANGS ON A TREE"),



14 that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.

Our bodies and minds are redeemed property of God. They are the Lord's.

1 Corinthians 6:20

For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.

Just as the body is not for sin or sexual immorality, the body is not for sickness. The body is for the Lord it belongs to Him, and the Lord who is Jehovah Rapha is for the body.

1 Corinthians 6:13

...Now the body is...for the Lord, and the Lord for the body.

Colossians 1:13-14

13 He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love,

14 in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.

AUTHORITY

God has authorized us to administer healing on the basis of the Cross, in the name of Jesus, through the ministry of the Word and the Spirit.

James 5:14-16

14 Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord.

15 And the prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.

16 Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much.

FAITH

Every person can receive God's provision through faith.



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Matthew 9:27-29

27 When Jesus departed from there, two blind men followed Him, crying out and saying, "Son of David, have mercy on us!"

28 And when He had come into the house, the blind men came to Him. And Jesus said to them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They said to Him, "Yes, Lord."

29 Then He touched their eyes, saying, "According to your faith let it be to you."

Jesus is the same today, as He was in Bible times.

Faith in God works the same way today, as in Bible times.

SUMMARY

Based on the Cross, the provision of our redemption, the authority vested in the Church and faith given to each of us - God's provision of healing is available and accessible to all of us.

Minister as the Spirit leads



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There is a simple guide for use in Life Group discussions. Our objective is to focus on the application of the Sunday sermon - how each one is becoming a doer of the Word and building their life on God's Holy Word. Preparation

Life Group Leader: To prepare for the Life Group meeting, you can listen to the Sermon or review the Sunday Sermon notes. Please do not make your life group read through the complete sermon notes during the life group. All you need to do is have individuals read the Scriptures listed below and then open for a time of discussion, sharing and learning using the questions given below. All these are available in the "All Peoples Church Bangalore" mobile App or online at our [sermons page](#). Pray for the Life Group meeting and invite the work and ministry of the Holy Spirit.

Welcome

The Life Group meeting may commence with a time of prayer, worship, and a fun activity.

LISTEN to God's Word

Read the following Scripture references: *Isaiah 53:4-5; Matthew 8:16-17; Deuteronomy 28:58-61; Galatians 3:13-14*

INVESTIGATE God's Word Together

Life Group is a discussion-based, participatory meeting with everyone given the opportunity to share their learning. Please discuss a few of these together, giving time for people to share their insights. We encourage each one individually to make notes of their personal learning during the Group discussion.



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Q1, How do we know beyond doubt that healing has been provided in the atonement (Christ's sacrifice on the Cross)? What are the implications, e.g. healing is therefore available to ALL just as forgiveness of sins is available for ALL, etc.

Q2, What does it mean to be redeemed from the curse of the Law, in the light of Jesus being made a curse for us on the Cross? This is often referred to as the divine exchange – He was cursed so we could be blessed. What are the curses we have been redeemed from based on Deuteronomy 28:15-68? What are some of these blessings that come upon us?

Each one can take a few (3 minutes max) to share one or two key insights and how they see themselves applying it to their specific life situations. Encourage each one to participate and share.

FELLOWSHIP by sharing your life and spiritual journey

Each one takes a few (3 minutes max) to share anything from their walk with God, something God has been teaching them, a testimony of answered prayer or a specific challenge that they would like prayer for. Encourage each one to participate and share.

ENCOURAGE each other by praying and ministering to one another

Get into small groups of two or three and take turns to thank God and pray for each other in the light of what was learnt today. Listen to the Holy Spirit. Expect the gifts of the Holy Spirit to flow, bringing healing, releasing miracles, prophecy, etc.

Regroup and pray together for:

- 1, families to be protected and strengthened*
- 2, a mighty outpouring of God's Holy Spirit on us as a church and through us to bless many others in our city and nation. Nothing but a mighty work of God's Spirit can change our city and nation.*
- 3, for the BUILD TO IMPACT project - for all details to go well as we plan and build our Bible college and church facilities to serve the Lord and people.*
