



**What is so Different About Jesus?**  
**Sunday December 28, 2025 – Sermon Outline**

Looking back in 2025, we did several individual messages at the beginning of the year and also several study series on The Anointing, The Believer's Walk, Royal Priesthood, The Gospel of John, and Divine Healing. This week – this Christmas week – we are reflecting on the “Whys” to our faith in Jesus Christ. On Christmas Day, we shared in brief why we believe in Jesus. Today, we continue on that theme and answer another question on why we believe Jesus Christ is unique. What is so different about Jesus Christ? Why do we believe ONLY in Jesus Christ?

**#1, JESUS CHRIST IS UNIQUE IN WHO HE IS**

Jesus Christ was not just another man, but He was/is God who became a Man. He was God incarnate. He was born by the power of the Holy Spirit through a virgin. He was sinless. Therefore, He was human and yet unlike any other human person. All people are subject to sin, satan and death. But Jesus Christ, though being a Man, was not subject to sin, satan and death. And hence He alone was qualified to become our Substitute, pay for our sins, take our sins out of the way, and make a way for us to be forgiven and brought into fellowship with God.

**1 Timothy 2:5-6 (GNB)**

**5 For there is one God, and there is one who brings God and human beings together, the man Christ Jesus,**  
**6 who gave himself to redeem the whole human race. That was the proof at the right time that God wants everyone to be saved,**

While there were and are many “good”, noble, people – yet in essence, we are all under sin. Only Jesus is God who became Man and hence He remains unique and distinct in this.

**#2, JESUS CHRIST IS UNIQUE IN HIS RESURRECTION**

The reason the early disciples went about preaching Jesus is because they believed in something very unique – that Jesus Christ had risen from the dead. This was not a myth, a fictitious story – but something they saw, experienced and hence preached.

When the apostles were instructed by religious leaders not to preach in the name of Jesus, their response was simple: *"For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard."* (Acts 4:20).

Now, when you consider the proposition – proclaiming that Jesus Christ who had died had been raised and the He saved, healed, delivered people and worked miracles – that was a “tall order”. It this was a lie – it would have been a “hard sell” – impossible to get people to believe this.

The apostle Paul himself stated this:

### **1 Corinthians 15:14,17 (GNB)**

**14 and if Christ has not been raised from death, then we have nothing to preach and you have nothing to believe.**

**17 And if Christ has not been raised, then your faith is a delusion and you are still lost in your sins.**

Yet, they preached Christ, the One who was crucified and raised up from the dead. They preached that Jesus would save, heal, deliver and work miracles and that is what He did – and with great power and miracles the apostles gave witness to the resurrection of Jesus Christ (Acts 4:33).

No other religious persuasion, faith, philosophy has made such a claim, and no other has at its foundation the resurrection of the One in whom they believe.

Additionally, the Bible points to His coming again. Not only do we believe that Jesus died and rose again – but we also proclaim that He is coming again:

### **Acts 1:9-11 (GNB)**

**9 After saying this, he was taken up to heaven as they watched him, and a cloud hid him from their sight.**

**10 They still had their eyes fixed on the sky as he went away, when two men dressed in white suddenly stood beside them**

**11 and said, "Galileans, why are you standing there looking up at the sky? This Jesus, who was taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way that you saw him go to heaven."**

## **#3, JESUS CHRIST IS UNIQUE IN HIS IMPACT ON HUMANITY**

When we think that Jesus Christ who lived and died in such a humble manner and yet - has such influence in the world today – it should make us think, why? How could a Man who lived a humble carpenter's life, preached a mere three years, and never did anything that we would typically attribute to "greatness" or "continuity" – have such an impact on human history?

He must be truly who the Bible says He is – Emmanuel – God with us.

### **Acts 4:12 (GNB)**

**Salvation is to be found through him alone; in all the world there is no one else whom God has given who can save us.**

Being single minded about Jesus Christ does not mean we are not open to listening to what others have to say. Of course, we listen – but having become aware of all other options out there, the fact is plain and simple – there is no one else who can match up to the uniqueness of Jesus Christ.

Being single minded about Jesus Christ does not mean we are intolerant, condemning or condescending of other persuasions. The Lord Jesus Himself stated that He did not come to condemn the world but that the world through Him might be saved. Our singlemindedness about Jesus Christ simply means we are absolutely CLEAR and thoroughly CONVINCED about His absolute uniqueness and nothing else and no one else comes anywhere close. Hence, we are willing to lovingly and gently speak the truth and address genuine questions. We are in no way threatened or intimidated by any opposition, because TRUTH is clarified and amplified as we respond to questions.

### **Acts 16:30-31 (GNB)**

**30 Then he led them out and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"**

**31 They answered, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved—you and your family."**
